How to apply for services through ***Hand in Hand***:

- Call 970-526-2439 or 970-520-4212 to schedule an orientation.
- Allow about an hour for the orientation. The orientation will include review of your court order, discussion about fees, and review of parenting time guidelines.
- Since the orientation is adult conversation, sometimes not appropriate for children's ears, it is best to have this time be adults only.
- A separate time can be scheduled to introduce the child or children to the visitation area.
- When both parties have been oriented, the first parenting time session or safe exchange may be scheduled.
